Christopher Street Liberation Day, 1971 is the second birthday celebration of the Gay Liberation Movement which grew out of the Christopher Street uprisings of 1969. On that day, thousands of Gay women and men took to the streets in protest against centuries of oppression. June 28, 1970 was the 1st Christopher Street Liberation Day Celebration. Tens of thousands took part in the festivities of Gay Pride Week in New York, which culminated in a mass march up 6th Avenue to Central Park for a Gay-In.

As no other event in the brief history of the Gay Liberation Movement, Christopher Street Liberation Day rekindled the spirit of coming out in the open and establishing homosexual as a valid way of loving. We march again this year to re-affirm our pride in ourselves and our solidarity with our Gay brothers and sisters.

This year we expect many more people to participate in the events in this country and abroad. The Gay Liberation Movement has mushroomed; and Christopher Street Liberation Day has attracted its attention. Planning, co-ordinating, and publicizing this major event will require help in all areas. Help us build this event. Spread the word in your area, in your campus press and underground newspapers. Plan to participate, either in New York or in your own locality.

Quicksilver and freaks,  
I must relate to you the occurrences that took place in Ft. Bragg, North Carolina.

On May 3rd, the 82nd Airborne Division was alerted for D.C. The lifers went wild. Blood was on the end of their bayonets before they even got to the capitol. They, the lifers, wanted to grab every freak they saw and court martial him for something they didn't understand. I asked one lifer, to see if he knew why the freaks were demonstrating. He told me that they were just a bunch of chicken-shit bastards afraid to go to Nam and fight. So I gave my power to the people, he tripped going down a flight of stairs.

As I watched the pigs unload you into the wire fence by the Collesium, I felt bad 'cause I

wasn't with my people!

In D.C., we stayed at Andrews A.F.B. to await movement to the action area. I wished I could have gone to the front lines so I would have been able to help from the inside.

Before we returned to Ft. Bragg, myself and several other freaks staged our own demonstration by placing our weapons with the bayonets into the ground, and placed our steel pots on the butts.

Please remember your brother freaks who were too foolish to see ahead and are trapped like me.

Power is arising in the people.
